THE VIOLIN SONATAS

Beethoven Revisited

offers a fresh and vibrant perspective on these beloved masterpieces - bridging the gap between historical practices/ authenticity and modern performance.

Beethoven's violin sonatas are a cornerstone of the classical repertoire, performed countless times on concert stages worldwide. Most modern interpretations adhere strictly to Beethoven's notation, remaining faithful to the printed score but often overlooking expressive elements familiar to musicians of his time—such as affect, cantabile, and tempo rubato.

Beethoven Revisited explores alternative approaches to these works by drawing on historical performance practices, breathing new life into them with greater dramatic impact and variety.

By reclaiming this sense of expressive freedom, we reimagine Beethoven's violin sonatas not as static museum pieces but as living, evolving works of art.

Jacqueline Ross and Artem Belogurov

Jacqueline Ross, violin, Professor at Guildhall School of Music and Drama, is a versatile violinist specialising in historical performance practices. She enjoys a distinguished career on both modern and period instruments. Educated at Juilliard, with further studies in contemporary and baroque violin in Germany and Amsterdam, Ross has made significant contributions to classical music. Her accomplishments include recordings of Schubert's complete works for violin and fortepiano, Bach's complete solo works, and a new edition of Clara Schumann's "Drei Romanzen" for Bärenreiter. *Beethoven Revisited* is her latest project.

Artem Belogurov, piano, Professor at Utrecht Conservatory, co-director of Ensemble Postscript, and research project Romantic Lab, is equally at home at the modern piano, harpsichord, clavichord and the many varieties of historical pianos. His repertoire ranges through four centuries of solo, concerto and chamber repertoire. He is particularly interested in research relating to Romantic performance practice and enjoys experimenting with and reviving forgotten expressive devices.



Jacqueline performs on a Nicolo Amati violin dating from the mid-17th century for this project. Early keyboard specialist Artem loves to perform on the fortepiano, but is equally happy with a modern grand piano.
